1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – Sept) against the agreed project implementation timetable (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end September).

The agreed implementation timetable included the following activities up to the end of September 2022:

- 1.1: Assemble diverse coalition of Liberian organizations working in chimpanzee conservation, gender equality, and poverty alleviation.
- 1.2: Convene stakeholder meetings with local organizations in Liberia, ensuring representation and participation of gender and economic equality groups.
- 2.1: Review existing research on chimpanzee protection, demand reduction, traditional values, and their intersection with gender and economic equality.

The project has made progress against all of these. A coalition of 12 organizations has been approached (Activity 1.1), and 10 have enthusiastically confirmed their willingness to participate. Local partner LCRP is doing outreach to confirm participation of the remaining two. Two further institutions (including a government ministry and an indigenous peoples' organization) will also be approached. Individual meetings have been held with stakeholders to provide information on the project and explain the role they can play (Activity 1.2). The full coalition of organizations is scheduled to meet virtually on 17 November to orient stakeholder and prepare for the design phase in Q4.

A local research consultant has been hired and has undertaken a review of existing literature on chimpanzee protection and demand reduction (Activity 2.1). The research has been done in a coordinated way with coalition members supporting the work through information sharing and access to their own knowledge bases. This has included coordinating with other IWT Challenge Fund recipients in Liberia (FFI and WCF) in order to ensure our work is complementary and not duplicative. The researcher is currently designing the field research (KIIs and FGDs) that will be carried out in November.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments/lessons learnt that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.			
The project has been impacted by exchange rates. The unfavourable position of the Pound means that budgets are unexpectedly constrained. Hiring a researcher on the available budget was particularly challenging. The research design and plan had to be adjusted to accommodate. Minor delays in hiring are not expected to significantly impact the timetable, and it is expected that sufficient data can still be collected to properly inform the pilot design phase.
