The project start date was August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, therefore the project is in the preliminary stages. WCS recently submitted signed award papers and is in the process of submitting a financial claim request and as well as a change request. This change request will modify the start and end date, the log frame and various risk framework documents, including an updated risk register, the Change map and issue log.

The 3-country program (Belize, Guatemala and Honduras) staff have met twice in the first two months for kick off meetings discussing the project details, GAF documents and compliance necessary for the project. An additional planning meeting was done to discuss the project deliverables, timeline, adjustments and next steps moving the project forward. WCS Guatemala and Honduras are currently in the process of developing subaward agreements with partners for the implementation of community surveys. WCS Belize team is working on financial

submission claims, and activity 1.1 Literature review, with academic documents on file and documents shared from Honduras and Guatemala team.

WCS Belize Project Co-Manager Yamira Novelo Fuentes recently gave a presentation in Guatemala to members of the Trination Alliance for the Conservation of the Gulf of Honduras (TRIGOH), as well as fishers' association from Belize, Guatemala, and Honduras. The presentation aimed to bring awareness of this award detailing the project scope, background and objectives for the Gulf of Honduras. Additionally, Mrs. Novelo Fuentes spoke on the importance of standardizing the project survey implementation across the three countries, and WCS interest to gain additional stakeholders' feedback and collaboration to understand the threats of the GOH. The workshop also provided a medium for WCS to understand some of the current supplementary livelihood initiatives, threats, and challenges faced by fishers from all three countries. At the two-day event, Mrs. Novelo Fuentes had opportunities for discussion with fishers, government representatives, and other NGO's from the project site.

Issues that arose in the last 2 months include:

- 1. We will continue to monitor this issue closely and are awaiting confirmation from another organization to file a change request. This has also delayed the submission of the updated Change Map as we are waiting to identify a new sub-awardee.
- 2. Because of the delays in the award notice, the project start date was postponed from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, to August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. GAF documents still list the project end date as 31 October 2025. Originally, the project was scheduled for 18 months, but the reduction of 3 months will moderately impact the timeline, necessitating the expedited completion of deliverables. WCS will include an adjustment to the project end date in the Change Request to ensure effective and efficient delivery of activities.
