Progress to date: Two workshops were organized in Kinshasa and Brazzaville

This will result in the drafting of an action plan engaging all partners in the law enforcement in DRC and RoC.
1.3 Monitor trafficking routes and identify traffickers and consumers:
Progress to date : WCS is working with the Michigan State University to understand the supply chains of bushmeat, especially those of pangolins, crocodiles, great apes (gorillas, chimpanzees or bonobo), primates and other fully protected species in the markets of Kinshasa and Brazzaville. To date, two workshops and 6 focus groups were conducted in the two cities to understand the bushmeat

1.6 Monitor dwarf crocodile supply from source to city
Progress to date: During this period, the crocodile consultant
conducted an initial two-week site visit to the Lac Tele Conservation Reserve (LTCR) in RoC to identify objectives and establish protocols for achieving a better understanding of the crocodile bushmeat trade both within Congo and across its borders to DRC and
This approach and protocol will be implemented during the Q3 and Q4 of this project

the project has encountered over the last 3 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.
On 23 December 2018, DRC is going to organize the long-awaited general elections across the country with the results to be released in January 2019.
We will continue to monitor the situation as it develops and inform LTS and DEFRA if and when we anticipate any delays.
We also noted an unusual dry period in the north of RoC this year, which will likely impact one element of our crocodile survey work.
Wet seasons are both being pushed later and lasting shorter times with unpredictable weather patterns.
We will inform LTS and DEFRA of any delays if and when they arise.
